
# **2017**Mini Prospectus

#### Ustadha Umm Habeeb - Senior faculty member

Ustadha Umm Habeeb joins us from a family with a rich tradition of scholarship. She completed the memorisation of the Holy Qur'an by the age of 14. She then commenced an Alimah course, which she completed under the supervision of Muft I Qazi Hassan Raza by the age of 20. Ustadha Umm Habeeb studied advanced texts under the guidance of the erudite scholars Mufti Muhammad Asiam Bandyalvi and Mufti Muhammad Fazai Bandyalvi. Ustadha Umm Habeeb has a keen interest in the fields of Arabic Grammar and Jurisorudence.

### Ustadha Rummana Shaheen - Faculty member

Ustadha Rummana Shaheen initiated her Dars-e-Nizami studies at the age of 16, Endeavouring through the traditional sciences under the prestigious tutelage of the eminent Shaykh Syed Muhammad Riaz Hussain and Shaykh Naveed Jameel ash-Shaami, be rosperously graduated from Mohiuddin International Girls College. Subsequently, she progressed to advanced studies under the guidance of the renowned and authoritative Mufti Ashfaq Ahmed Rizvi.

#### Ustadha Shabina Shah - Faculty member

Ustadha Shabina first started teaching Tajweed at the age of 18 after formally qualifying under the supervision of Ustadha Safiyya Farooq, She then received jiazaa to teach Tajweed by Shaykh Maher Munajjid a renowned teacher of Giraat from Abu Noor University in Damascus. She received a further license to transmit knowledge of Guranic recitation from a London based institute.

She has held many prominent teaching positions including the Tajweed module co-ordinator for Apex primary school in Essex. Ustadha Shabina specialises in the subject of Tajweed and is currently furthering her own studies across a broad range of subjects.

### Ustadha Madiha Fatema Yunus - Faculty member

Ustadha Madiha commenced studies at Mohiuddin International Girls College under the guidance of Mufti Ashfaq Ahmed Ridawi, Shaykh Naveed Jameel ash-Shaami, Syed Riaz Hussain, and Syed Ghulam Dastagir Gilani. She furthered her education at Jamia al-Karam benefiting from Shaykh Imdad Hussain Pirzada, Shaykh Gul Muhammad al-Azhari and Shaykh Mahboob Hussain al-Azhari.

She has a good grounding in all Islamic sciences and is currently pursuing advanced secular education in the fields of biology and chemistry.

We are looking forward to welcoming additional faculty members for the new academic year.

The Islamic studies course is intended primarily for young adults, designed to facilitate a broad range of students from different walks of life. Some have previous experience of Islamic courses; whilst for others. it is their first exposure to formal Islamic studies.

The program is based on the traditional curriculum of the 'Alimah course', and provides a firm and broad basis in all of the main disciplines of the renowned Dars-e-Nizami syllabus.

Though the program itself is for English-speaking students, students will be moved slowly to Arabic reading fluency so that they can study the different disciplines in the language of the scholars. This will typically involve covering various classical Arabic manuals in each Islamic discipline, thereby giving students a taste of the rich academic tradition.

The course structure has been developed with the provision of '2 year milestones'. Students are expected to complete two years of foundational studies before progressing onto intermediate level studies and then continue onto advanced studies. After four years of intense study, most of our students will be competent enough to teach foundational subjects whilst also studying at a higher level on the path towards scholarship.

# The Tajweed INTENSIVE SHORT COURSE

This course is suitable for complete beginners as well as those who have studied some Tajweed before. In particular, suitable for those adults who are looking for a "refresher course". On completion of this course, students are expected to have developed a firm understanding of the rules of Tajweed as well as becoming familiar with the point of articulation and characteristics of each letter of the Arabic alphabet. Recitation focuses on Surah Fatiha and selected short Surahs from Juz Amma.

Our Crèche
